

Windsor-Essex is one of four new sites in Ontario to receive provincial funding for the new Youth Wellness Hub – a one stop shop for youth to access mental health services. Windsor-Essex CMHA, Hotel-Dieu Grace Healthcare, Maryvale, The Bridge and Windsor-Essex Community Healthcare will work together along with families to design the Hub.

Over 1100 individual received team-based primary care services in 2020 from the Team Care Centre, including +3700 mental health visits among the teams Nurse Practitioners and therapists/counselors.

WECF Emergency Response Fund

The WindsorEssex Community Foundation (WECF) established the WECF Emergency Response Fund. This fund, initiated with a contribution from the **WindsorEssex Community Foundation** and supported by generous contributions by local philanthropists and corporate partners, will support charities across Windsor-Essex County providing front-line services to vulnerable populations whose staff, volunteers, programs, operations and revenue has been negatively affected by the Coronavirus (COVID-19).

Investment Readiness Program

The WindsorEssex Community Foundation **(WECF)** is the lead of the Southwestern Ontario regional Consortium, partnering with five local organizations: the Sarnia Community Foundation, the Windsor-Essex Regional Chamber of Commerce, Workforce WindsorEssex, the Downtown Windsor Business Accelerator, and the University of Windsor Entrepreneurship, Practice, and Innovation Centre (EPICentre) to support social purpose organizations in our region (Windsor-Essex-Sarnia). The Investment Readiness Program (IRP) helps deliver capital from the Government of Canada to social purpose organizations preparing to successfully participate in the social finance market. As a regional Partner with CFC delivering the IRP, the WECF will help empower others to unlock innovative solutions to social challenges.

Equality Fund

The WindsorEssex Community Foundation **(WECF)** is one of 21 local community foundations across Canada that are taking part. The Fund builds on efforts to shift power to women, girls, Two-Spirit, and gender-diverse people, and will work towards a future grounded in justice and gender equality. In total, these community foundations are granting \$3.5M towards the women's movement.
