

Canadian Mental



Through the Housing First Program, **Family Services Windsor-Essex (FSWE)** helps people with the greatest level of need find affordable rental housing. FSWE works with people who have been chronically homeless and have a significant mental health and/or addiction concern. Housing First Workers also provide these clients with weekly advocacy and support for up to three years, connecting people with other programs such as mental health and addiction services, with the goal of maintaining tenancy and reducing issues of safety and security for people who are chronically homeless. *fswe.ca*



Windsor-Essex will need 30,400 new homes by 2031 to meet the demand for new housing, according to a new report from the Smart Prosperity Institute.


